This week we will highlight the St John of God Hospitaller Ministries.

Saint John of God Hospitaller Ministries is an international organisation providing a range of health and social care services for children and adults. They work in partnership with government departments, health and educational authorities and other statutory and voluntary agencies.

In Ireland they provide services in the areas of intellectual disability, mental health and older people. The St John of God Hospitaller Ministries were founded in 1537, established services at St Raphael's Celbridge in 1952 for people with an intellectual disability. Saint John of God Kildare Services provides a range of services for over 400 children and adults with intellectual disability in north Kildare. Their services are based at St Raphael's, Celbridge, and in the towns of Celbridge, Leixlip, Maynooth and Clane. They work in partnership with individuals and families to develop services that are responsive to their needs and reflect international best policy and practice. Their Mission is to support and empower people with intellectual disability to be active participants in the community in which they live. The philosophy of the Hospitaller Order of Saint John of God is that people are the creation of God, with intrinsic value and inherent dignity.
