Catholic Schools Week in from Jan 29th-Feb 4th

A message from Fr. Paul Taylor P.P.

We give thanks for the ways in which our Catholic parish schools are welcoming, affirming and enabling our young people to grow in knowledge, wisdom and joy.

Working together with parents, teachers, young people and our parish faith commu-I nity we desire to nurture the rich potential for the future our children represent to build a "civilization of love".

- ■ In some sections of the media there is a concealed effort to suggest that Catholic schools have a "baptism barrier". This is not true. The real problem is that the state is <u>not</u> providing sufficient school places and choices for families in areas where the number of pupils exceeds the school capacity of the area.

We should also remind people that the vast majority of our Catholic schools were built on land bought by the parish and that the parishoners paid substantial sums towards the building of the schools in the first place and their maintanence. Great sacrifices were made by generations of parishoners to provide educational opportunity to many when the state did little or nothing. Fair is fair and the truth should be told as we face an ideological assault by some who want to "grab" our schools. Catholics are tax payers too and have a right to their schools as do other Christians, be-I lievers in other faiths and non believers too. Le us have real diversity of choice but not an unjust grab of Catholic schools.
